


WHERE TO ENTER

Your self-guided tour supports both the entrances! Each entrance is available as a separate tour version.

ITINERARIES

You can enjoy the park at your own pace with the self-guided audio tour from Action Tour Guide.

This flexible tour can be completed in one day. Since it is valid for one year and offers unlimited usage, you don't have to worry about seeing everything in one visit.

ONE-DAY ITINERARY:

- Start your day early by entering Crater Lake National Park through one of the entrances. Be sure to download the app and tour in advance, as cell service can be limited in the area.
- Begin by driving along the scenic routes and stop at the must-see points (marked in the tour as "Must-See"):
 - Rim Village
 - Watchman Peak Trailhead
 - Merriam Point
 - Vidae Falls
 - Sun Notch Trailhead
 - Phantom Ship Overlook
- Plan a few hikes along the scenic route, depending on your time and interest. (See the hikes section.)
- Enjoy a picnic lunch at one of the designated picnic areas, such as Rim Village or Watchman Peak Trailhead, where you can admire the stunning views of the lake while relaxing and refuelling for the rest of your adventure.
- End your day by watching the sunset from a scenic viewpoint. Consider locations like Watchman Peak Trailhead or Phantom Ship Overlook to witness the golden hues reflecting off the deep blue waters of Crater Lake as the day comes to a close. WHERE TO STAY



CHILOQUIN

Just north of Crater Lake, Chiloquin offers rustic cabins and hotels amidst forests and rivers, ideal for anglers and outdoor lovers.

CRESCENT

Located about 45 miles north of Crater Lake, Crescent serves as a cozy gateway with a variety of lodging options, including charming cabins and guesthouses.

PROSPECT

Close to the Rogue River near Crater Lake's south-central side, Prospect features historic inns and scenic natural wonders, perfect for exploring the area.

GLIDE

Located west of Crater Lake, Glide is known for its Umpqua River access and lush landscapes, with accommodations ranging from bed and breakfasts to riverfront

KNOW BEFORE YOU GO



ENTRANCE FEES: An entrance fee or valid park pass is required to access Crater Lake National Park. Review pass options.



PERMITS & RESERVATIONS: Reservations are required for campgrounds and other activities, which is not included in the self-guided tour. Reserve here before your trip.



OPERATING HOURS: The Park is open year-round, 24 hours a day. However during the winter season, accessibility to many park roads may be limited or closed due to snowfall. Learn more before you go.



ROAD CLOSURES: Unexpected weather or construction incidents can affect roads. The North Entrance Road and East & West Rim Drives may be restricted due to winter conditions, and the road between Skell Head and Phantom Ship Overlook, including Cloudcap Road, is closed due to the East Rim Drive Rehabilitation Project, expected to be completed by 2028. Check before you leave.



PARK RULES AND SAFETY: Stay on designated trails, camp in designated areas, and respect wildlife and natural resources by following the Camping Rules and Regulations. Follow all NPS Laws and Policies. Be familiar with the park's Safety Guidelines.
